## Chapter Public Awareness Grant Awarded to AIA Flint

The Michigan Architectural Foundation has awarded the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Flint Chapter \$1,200 to digitize the Guide to Flint Architecture, the first guide in the state created by architects for the benefit and education of our community. AIA Flint has maintained this printed Guide to Flint Architecture pamphlet for over a decade and in 2014 began efforts to digitize this information.

At that time, AIA Flint was granted funds from MAF and AIA National to create short videos of each of the buildings in the Flint Guide. This project was a tremendous success and all of the videos currently reside on YouTube and are linked through the [AIA Flint website](#). AIA Flint saw these video shorts as a great new way to engage with social media and modern technology that is popular and accessible through multiple platforms.
