Architectural Feature Story AIA Michigan 2012 Design Winners



Kettering University Incubator Building Flint, Michigan

This 12,000-square-foot, multi-tenant facility called **the Kettering University Science and Technology Incubator Building** will support scientific and technologically-based 'start-up' companies that need dedicated laboratory space during their first three or four years.

The \$2.7 million facility is being made possible by support from the U.S. Department of Commerce, State of Michigan funds through the City of Flint, and the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation.

Prospective companies for this new incubator will come from:

- "spinouts" from regional universities, their faculty members and student entrepreneurs;
- regional scientific and technological entrepreneurial start-ups and
- entrepreneurial start-up companies currently outside Michigan but wish to re-locate.




